East African Revival CENTENARY CONFERENCE

THE EAST AFRICAN REVIVAL WAS AND STILL IS A MOVE OF GOD IN **EAST AFRICA AND** BEYOND.

The East African Revival, which began in the late 1920s and spread through the 1930s and 1940s, had a profound impact on the Christian Church in East Africa. It reshaped the Anglican Church, contributed to its significant growth, and influenced the language, morals, and spiritual practice of Protestant churches in the region.

The movement emphasized an internalized Christian faith. high ethical standards, and strong bonds of corporate fellowship, with a vision of a transnational community of Christians.

The Revival also allowed women to assert greater moral and spiritual authority.

REVIVAL IS PERSONAL

The East African Revivalists followed the pattern of earlier revivalists.

- Simeon Nsibambi in Gahini prayed regularly, spent hours alone in a hut, waiting for God, seeking transformation
- Joe Church left Gahini, retreated in Kampala, praying for God to fill him with the Holy Spirit and empower him for the work of making Jesus known, treating the sick and teaching.
- Festo Kivengere told of the power of God that drove his evangelism.

Each of these pioneers of the East African Revival described their personal utter dependence on Jesus. This movement grew from the openness of such individuals to God's call and their personal spiritual revival as a witness to others.
