### **News from the Council**

Council continues to work on a number of fronts:

- Through the representation of the Executive Officer Council is providing a Faith voice into the current public discussions on the End of Life Legislation
- Council is also active in the VicPol Multifaith Committee as this committee attempts to establish a Youth Council and is seeking young Christians to represent the Churches

- The Council continues to work with the planning committee for the 500th Commemoration of the Reformation—flyer later in Newsletter

- Council is continuing to explore avenues to enable churches to be able to respond appropriately to the raft of new legislation before it:

- i. Child Safe Standards that are now enforceable in Victoria for all Faith Communities
- ii. Reportable Conduct Scheme that comes into law at the beginning of 2018
- iii. Responding to the recommendations tabled in the Domestic Violence Royal Commission in Victoria.

Linked by the culture of their Wadawurrung ancestors, mother and daughter artists, Aunty Marlene Gilson and Deanne Gilson have developed two concurrent solo exhibitions exploring their differing styles and techniques.

*What If?* by Aunty Marlene presents a series of new works in her signature narrative style, telling iconic stories of her Country and community. *Murnong: Yam Daisies* by Deanne, presents an installation of ceramics and paintings as an investigation into the loss of women's traditional practices through colonisation into the contemporary present. *The Victorian State Government has gazetted changes to the Working with Children's Checks.* These changes come into effect on the 1st August 2017. Essentially, the change tightens the requirements for WWC checks so that all adults who come in contact with children within Faith communities require a WCC check.


### **Dozens of countries sign nuclear weapons ban treaty**
